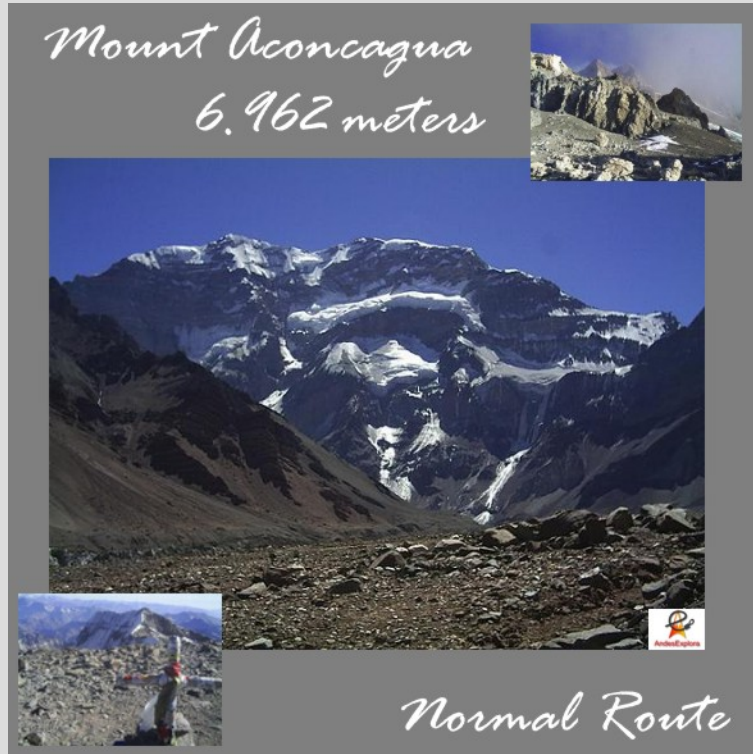


**CLIMB ITINERARY**  
**CODE: ACON PREMIUM PACK**



<b>DAY 1:</b>	Group meets in Mendoza, Argentina. Equipment check and afternoon briefing will be at the hotel. For dinner we will have a chance to taste fine Argentinean cuisine and wine.
<b>DAY 2:</b>	Drive West from Mendoza to Puente del Inca. where we begin our acclimatization in Puente del Inca Area. An afternoon hike is recommended, though optional.
<b>DAY 3:</b>	We will begin our approach to Base Camp. Around 45 to 60 minutes approach gives us the chance to begin our acclimatization until Horcones Rangers at 2.950 meters in order to check in the park. We follow the Horcones Valley, and camp our first night in Confluencia in about 3 hours at 3.390 meters. Mules carry our gear.
<b>DAY 4:</b>	Hike to the base of the South Face of Aconcagua, at 4.200 meters, toward Plaza Francia. You will see famous ascend in alpine style, like Paragon route, Sudtirolesa, etc. Return to Confluencia to spend our 2nd night, before heading to Base Camp the next day. This hike will facilitate our acclimatization process.
<b>DAY 5:</b>	After a day Journey through colorful desert landscape called "Playa Ancha" It`s a long and full way with geological formation, we reach our Base Camp, Plaza de Mulas, at 4.350 meters.
<b>DAY 6:</b>	Rest and acclimatization day at Base Camp. We will practice snow and ice techniques near to Cerro Cuerno North position from plaza de mulas.
<b>DAY 7:</b>	Carry a load to Camp I, Plaza Canada, at 5.050 meters. Return to Base Camp.

<b>DAY 8:</b>	Leave Base Camp. Move to Camp I Plaza Canada.
<b>DAY 9:</b>	Carry a load to Camp II, Nido de Condores at 5.560 meters and come back to spend the night at Plaza Canada.
<b>DAY 10:</b>	Leave Camp I. Move to Camp II Nido de Condores.
<b>DAY 11:</b>	Carry a load to Camp III, Berlin at 5.930 meters.
<b>DAY 12:</b>	Move to Camp III. This unique spot will be our High Camp where we will spend at least 2 nights. Here we are surrounded waiting for good weather conditions to attempt to Aconcagua Summit.
<b>DAY 13-14-15:</b>	Summit! Weather permitting. We allow a window for our Summit Day in case of poor weather and depending on how group is acclimatizing.
<b>DAY 16:</b>	Descend from Camp III to Base Camp (Plaza de Mulas).
<b>DAY 17:</b>	Hike out the Horcones Valley in trance with your self & Experienced on the highest America's Summit. Spending the night in Puente del Inca.
<b>DAY 18:</b>	Drive to Mendoza. Enjoy delicious banquet with your team. Spend night in Mendoza. Next Day fly home or continue traveling in South America.

**This itinerary is intended to be a guideline only, weather days and rest days are always a possibility while on a climbing trip.**

#### **COST INCLUDES**

Mountain Guides, 2 nights hotel accommodation in Mendoza at the Mendoza Park Hyatt Hotel with breakfast buffet included (FIVE star hotel) ; 1 night at the beginning of the expedition and 1 night at the end of the expedition, 2 nights hotel accommodation in Puente del Inca, breakfasts and dinners in Puente del Inca, all land transportation, mules, all expedition food, all community gear such as; tents, stoves, cooking gear, medical kits, satellite phone, radios, pulse-oximeters, etc., and Aconcagua permit fee.

#### **YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR**

Round Trip Flights to and from Mendoza, meals in Mendoza, Personal equipment, passport, personal items and services (laundry, snacks, drinks, tips, etc.), \*Porter fee (if used), and expenses incurred in the case of a rescue. Extra expenses for early departure from the expedition, such as non scheduled mules, etc.

#### **PRE-POST OPTIONS**

For Normal Route Porters are only available, but not included, you need to let us know if you wish a porter and we will have it all arranged for you. Porters cost \$120 to \$160 per load carry .You will need a maximum of 5 to 6 load carries from Base Camp to High Camp and back down to Base Camp again, if you choose to have a porter for each carry, and move, and for the descent of the mountain. Porters will be available at Base Camp. The final number of estimated load carries may be decided at Base Camp.

Including flight re-scheduling, reservation changes, travel arrangements, ideas, and solutions in the event that the expedition finishes ahead of schedule.
